

Lesson 1 - Introduction

Introduction

Nearly all of the information available on the life of Christ comes from Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Each book has its own theme and purpose, and therefore uncertainty arises about the exact order of some events. It is the purpose of this class, however, to develop a comprehensive view of the life of Christ. We will do so by identifying ten major periods of His life and learning to group the events of Jesus' life in the major period in which they occurred.

We will also endeavor to gain a greater appreciation of the ebb and flow of His ministry: the rise and fall of His popularity, the source and persistence of His opposition, and above all the manner in which Jesus remains in control of events even to the point of acquiescing to a horrid death.

Ten Major Periods

- 10. Resurrection and Appearances

1) Introduction

- a) We come to the next to last major period of the accounts of Jesus. This period lasted less than 24 hours, from late in the evening on Thursday (possibly even after midnight) till He was buried and a watch set at His tomb (probably right before sundown on Friday).
- b) Jesus was tried by both the Jews and Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor. We will try to organize our study of this day around His various trials.

- e) Women go to tell the disciples of the empty tomb (Luke 24:10)
- f) Mary Magdalene finds Peter and John who run to the tomb (John 20:2-9)
- g) Peter and John leave the tomb (John 20:10)
- h) Jesus appears to Mary outside the tomb (Mark 16:9, John 20:11-17)
- i) Jesus appears to the other two women (Matt. 28:9, 10)
- j) Mary tells the eleven of Jesus' appearance to her (Mark 16:10-11, John 20:18)
- k) Later that day Jesus appears to two men on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35)
- 1) Jesus appears to Peter (may have occurred prior to appearance to the two men) (Luke 24:34)
- m) Jesus appears to ten apostles and eats with them (John 20:19-23, Luke 24:36-43)
- n) Jesus appears one week later to all eleven apostles (John 20:24-31)
- o) Jesus appears to seven by the Sea of Galilee (John 21:1-24)
- p) Jesus appears to over five hundred brethren (I Cor. 15:6)
- q) Jesus appears to the eleven on a mountain in Galilee (Matt. 28:16-20)

- r) Jesus appears to James His brother (I Cor. 15:7)
- s) Jesus makes a final appearance to the eleven in Jerusalem (Luke 24:44-53, Acts 1:3-11)

3) Questions

- a) How many days was Jesus alive on the earth after His death (Acts 1:3)?
- b) What did He spend His time doing (Acts 1:3, Luke 24:45-49)?
- c) What evidence can you find in these appearances of a <u>physical</u> presence?
- d) What instructions did He leave the disciples?
- e) After His ascension what were the apostles told (Acts 1:10, 11)?
