The rote learning will consist of a set of facts about each book (see objectives above), each of which has a point value (usually = 1). A spreadsheet-type scorecard will be in each student's notebook and posted in the classroom where a record of the facts mastered will be kept. At the beginning and end of each class period the students will be given the opportunity to demonstrate newly mastered facts and earn points on the score sheet. Earning points will involve filling out the fact sheets for each book from memory, and demonstrating other basic skills such as locating cities on a map, identifying key characters, and remembering key dates of events. At the beginning of each class period, a set of drills, based on flash cards or directed questions will be conducted to reinforce previously learned material.

A lesson sheet (basic fact sheet) will be handed out in advance of each class period, so that much of the rote learning can be accomplished outside of class. The lesson sheet will have a list of the facts to be learned, including a memory verse required points and bonus work for extra points. Bonus points on any book may only be earned after the required facts have been mastered. Since most of the facts are on the lesson sheets, students can still earn points on books covered while they are absent.

Approximately 1/2 of the in-class time will be spent discussing the content of the material in the NT books and making application to everyday behavior.

Earning points (5-10 min)

Each student will keep a note book, which will include a score card for points earned, lesson sheets (basic fact sheet) for each book, notes taken during class discussions, maps, chronologies, and character lists as developed.

The application section of the lesson will involve reading a key text from the epistle, discussing its meaning to the readers, and then thinking of practical situations in which the student's behavior may need to change (in dealing with parents, siblings, class-mates, or in ethical decision-making situations).





 - Death of Jesus and Establishment of the church (33AD)
 - Paul's 4 trips (first, 46-47; second, 50-53; third, 54-58; fourth 58-61)
 - Paul's Imprisonment(s) (62-68)
 - Jerusalem destroyed (70)
 - Revelation written (later date), and close of NT authorship (95)



- Il Thessalonians was written shortly after the first letter.
- Some of the Christians thought Jesus would come very soon (or had already come) and stopped working.
- Paul encouraged them to remain faithful by telling them that Jesus would punish evil people at the end of time.
- Written about 51AD.
- Paul expected Christians to obey his letter just as if they were directly from God.
- Key teaching in the book: Remaining Faithful, what will happen before and when Jesus comes (falling away, and then punishment of those who do not obey the gospel).

 - Lots of Visitors
 - Lateness and Difficulty Parking
- C. Discuss Specific Actions that would be appropriate for each age group (cover only the one you are teaching). Set goals for accomplishing these improvements.

Smaller Children

- No noise, talking, or playing with loud toys
- Go to bathroom before each service (set goal never to leave during worship)
- Help your parents worship by being quiet and still
- Bow head during prayer, be very still during Lord's supper
- Keep a notebook of the lessons (words you know, overhead notes, etc)
- Control running and noise after worship (safety and concern for others)

Adolescents to Teens

- No noise, talking, or note writing
- Turn to, and sing, songs
- Use your Bible during lessons and readings
- Participate in prayers
- Go to bathroom before each service (set goal never to leave during worship)
- Sit where there will be fewer distractions (including whom you sit with)
- Keep a notebook of key points of the lessons

Adults

- Care to train children by example and specific discipline
- Set [family] goal to be early to worship for one entire month
- Turn to, and sing, songs; help children find and follow words and sing
- Use your Bible during lessons and readings, and Participate in prayers
- Take children to bathroom before service (set policy never to leave during worship)
- Sit where there will be fewer distractions
- Keep controllable noise to a minimum: watch alarms, paper rattling, clippers...
- D. Offer prayer for God to help us improve our worship.
