[**Note:** “*Merchants*” = Jewish trade controlled the wealth of the world practically speaking. Jewish bankers, etc controlled the economy (cf. Acts 8:27; Acts 16:14; Acts 18:1-3; illustrates this also) very much like today, the textile industry, the diamond market, the film industry, and many other industries. See Zechariah 14:14.]
